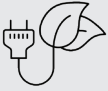
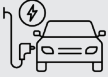


Public Charger Etiquette



We're All Equal

Every car has equal access to EV chargers – there's no hierarchy here.



Respect the Queue

Don't unplug other cars unless they've finished charging or you have permission.



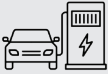
Know Your Limits

Observe time limits at chargers and move your vehicle before your time is up.



Check Your Charge

Time flies when you're having fun, but your car isn't going to unplug (or move) itself.



Charging, Not Parking

If you're not actively charging, it's time to move to a carpark.



Communication is Key

Use text alerts or apps like PlugShare to monitor your charge and communicate with other drivers.



E is for Emergency

E-stop should only be used in genuine emergencies.



Be Nice to ICE

Be a polite EV ambassador, even if an ICE car is parked in a charging bay.



OK to Check Progress

Use the charger's functionality to monitor the State of Charge and wait time.



Respect the Stations

Stow cables neatly and report any issues to the charger's service provider.
